

Stunning Music Stars in Kansas City Symphony's 2018/19 Season

KANSAS CITY, Mo. | Feb. 20, 2018 — Exhilarating, inspiring and well-balanced all at once — the Kansas City Symphony promises stunning music with a little something for everyone in the 2018/19 season.

"Our 2018/19 season is extraordinary," said Symphony Executive Director Frank Byrne. "With each season we strive to reach new heights of artistic excellence and reach new audiences. This coming season accomplishes that, and I am confident that we will delight and inspire audiences as never before. I am proud of the many ways our community can connect with the Kansas City Symphony and we can't wait to share these great concerts with you."

The 14-concert Classical Series begins in September and runs through June 2019. The Classical Series is available for purchase as the Bravo Series (7 concerts), Ovation Series (7 concerts) or Masterworks Series (all 14 concerts). The 2018/19 season will mark Music Director Michael Stern's 14th season this September and the Symphony's eighth season in Helzberg Hall at the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts.

"I'm thrilled by our 2018/19 season," Stern says. "We continue to accelerate our musical adventure together, making the case for music in this great American city by featuring multifaceted American composers from John Adams and Augusta Read Thomas to Aaron Copland and George Gershwin, to name only a few. A wonderfully eclectic work for percussion and orchestra based on Pat Metheny's music will receive its Kansas City premiere as do three splendid works by Anna Clyne, Sarah Kirkland Snider and Michael Kurth.

"We're also continuing our Mahler cycle with his transcendent Third Symphony, which has not been performed in Kansas City for more than three decades," Stern adds. "We welcome esteemed guest conductors, with first visits from Andrey Boreyko and Edo de Waart, plus exceptional soloists including our own Noah Geller, Mark Gibbs, Julian Kaplan and Chris McLaurin. Of course, we also have great music by Beethoven, Mozart, Brahms, Rachmaninoff, Haydn and Schubert as well as Orff's ever-popular *Carmina burana*. There's something for everyone in this season!"

The 2018/19 Symphony Pops Series offers entertaining fun with concerts led by David T. Beals III Associate Conductor Jason Seber.

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About the Kansas City Symphony and Chorus

Founded in 1982, the Kansas City Symphony has established itself as a major force in the cultural life of the community. Praised for performances of uncompromising standard, the orchestra is the largest in the region and enjoys a national reputation under the artistic leadership of Music Director Michael Stern. The Kansas City Symphony Chorus is a volunteer, 160-member ensemble led by multi-Grammy[®] Award-winning conductor, Charles Bruffy, that continues its long tradition of excellence as the choral voice of the Kansas City Symphony. The Kansas City Symphony performs more than 100 concerts each year, often welcomes guests of international acclaim as part of its Classical and Pops Series, and serves as the orchestra for the Kansas City Ballet and Lyric Opera of Kansas City.

Complementing its full schedule of concerts, the Symphony enriches the lives of Kansas City residents by providing music education opportunities for children and adults, such as KinderKonzerts, Young People's Concerts, an instrument petting zoo and concert comments. Highlights each season include a range of free master classes, events and concerts reaching more than 250,000 community members, including the annual Bank of America Celebration at the Station concert each Memorial Day weekend and performing at Symphony in the Flint Hills every summer.

The Symphony has released six highly praised CDs to date with Reference Recordings, with the most recent release featuring the Grammy[®] Award-nominated music of contemporary composer Adam Schoenberg (released January 20, 2017).
